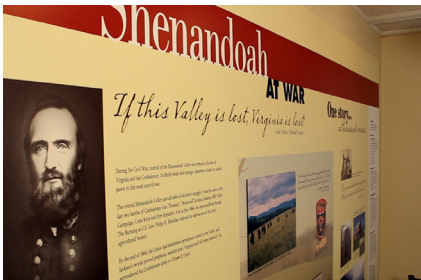
REFRESH YOURSELF ON THE SHENANDOAH BEERWERKS TRAIL.

HARRISONBURG HISTORY & HISTORIC PLACES

Harrisonburg has its own interesting past and has been witness to many of our nation's most historic events. Previously known as "Rocktown," Harrisonburg was named for Thomas Harrison who settled in the Shenandoah Valley in 1737 and eventually deeded acres in the area which is now known as Historic Downtown Harrisonburg. Harrisonburg and the surrounding area played significant roles in the American Civil War with lots of battlefields and cemeteries located within a short drive. However long before the Civil War, pioneers were migrating from Virginia and the northeast on their way to settle the rest of the continent. Many traveled along the Wilderness Road Migration Route, which roughly follows modern day Route 11. Catch up on your history here in the Burg!



FROM GEMSTONES TO OUTER SPACE
